

ABOUT OUR PROGRAM

The COC Street Outreach Committee is made up of representatives of various organizations, local government, police and members of the community.

The COC Street Outreach Team provides “on the street” services to Long Island’s unsheltered persons in need. Trained members offer crisis intervention and referrals for essential services, including emergency housing. Team members also distribute kits with clothes, non-perishable foods, blankets, and toiletries to individuals living on the street. The team also works with local shelters, businesses, and houses of worship to assist with resources.

Outreach is more than just working with individuals who are homeless. We work to create awareness through education and building connections in the community, as well as conducting drives for essential items to distribute to the homeless.

Street Outreach

Team members will have a first-hand opportunity to make a difference in someone’s life. We need people who are able to dedicate a few hours each month to spend time talking with unsheltered people hear their stories and provide them with resources.

Volunteers will join an experienced street outreach team who will guide you through each part of outreach.

Community Awareness and Education

Participants can help build resources and materials that will be presented to community groups and stakeholders seeking information on how to better serve the homeless in our community. As part of the group objectives, we will reach out to hospitals regarding the process for discharging homeless patients and also providing outreach training to the community.

Organizational Outreach

Members engage local business owners, civic associations, faith-based organizations etc. by providing resources and creating resource documents that can be posted at various public locations. They will create awareness for our neighbors in need and build connections to the community which serve as important resources for Outreach work.

Homeless Advocacy

Long Island has limited resources and community support for the various sub populations of homeless that are not eligible for DSS emergency housing. Team members build relationships with organizations, churches, and groups that can provide assistance to the most vulnerable and overlooked populations.
